Board Approves

Drive-Thru Annual Meeting

You won't have to worry about finding a parking spot at the East Central Electric (ECE) Annual Meeting this year —or the health and wellbeing of your family. In the wake of the global pandemic, this year ECE will host a drive-thru event. Co-op trustees approved the change in format at their May board meeting.

“ECE must place its priorities on ensuring the safety of our members and employees. Because the enclosed environment and crowds at our meeting could put people at greater risk of infection, we came up with a drive-thru alternative,” said Tim Smith, ECE general manager.

The event will take place on September 10 from 1 pm until 7 pm at ECE headquarters in Okmulgee. While remaining in their cars, members

will enter along Cemetery Road and follow the marked route. At stops along the way, members will pick up their ECE Annual Report, ballot, and survey card, enjoy free refreshments, and vote for trustees. Members will automatically receive a \$30 credit to their account after registering. Safe distance will be respected at all times. Registered members are eligible for more than \$8,000 in cash prizes. Lucky winners will be announced in the ECE newsletter, website and social media.

As members drive the route, they will notice signs and banners about co-op services. Tuning to 106.3FM as they drive, they will enjoy a stream of news and information about ECE programs and services.

Getting Fiber? Make Sure Your Equipment is Up To Date

You can't put a lead saddle on a racehorse and expect it to win. Unfortunately, some ecoLINK subscribers are saddled with outdated electronic equipment that hinders them from realizing the full benefits of high-speed fiber broadband.

"EcoLINK's service is sized to support all of your connected devices at the same time, but it's often faster than one device can handle," said Jeremy Hendrickson, ecoLINK director of broadband operations.

Newer devices such as computers, tablets, TVs, and routers are able to handle higher speeds, but those sold five or more years ago may not be able to take full advantage of the gigabit service, he added.

The maximum speed for ecoLINK service using Wi-fi or Ethernet is 940 mbps. Please make sure your devices meet the minimum speeds for gigabit service. For members who would rather not update their equipment, Hendrickson advises hardwiring your internet using Ethernet cable rather than Wi-fi.

Local Aid For Storm Victims

When a tornado ripped through Keefeton, ECE's Operation Roundup reached out with more than \$38,000 in financial aid.

For residents of Keefeton, the morning of May 15 arrived like a freight train. That morning at 9:38 am, an EF-1 twister packing 110 mph winds cut a 4.8 mile swath through the tiny community south of Muskogee, damaging or destroying roughly sixteen homes. Minor injuries were reported.

As residents picked through the debris the following day, East Central Electric staff arrived to offer Keefeton homeowners some welcome news. Thanks to donations by their fellow electric co-op members to ECE's Operation Roundup, Keefeton residents were eligible to receive financial aid at a time when they needed it the most.

In June, Operation Roundup trustees approved 30 grant applications from affected Keefeton residents totaling more than \$38,000. Lylah Sparks,

ECE member services representative said the board plans to review additional applications related to the storm at their next meeting.

“The priority was to assure prompt assistance to the members who received severe damage and/or total loss from the storm,” Sparks added.

Out of 30 applications, five homes were completely destroyed, and eight suffered severe structural damage. The remaining applications listed damages to windows, roofs, siding, and water damage.

The storm also damaged numerous poles, power lines, transformers and outbuildings throughout eastern portions of ECE's power grid. More than 1,100 members lost power. Fighting flooded roads, debris and other obstructions, crews worked as

quickly as possible to restore service.

In Keefeton, ECE member Sissy Moore said her neighborhood was especially grateful for the fast restoration of service and the courtesy of ECE employees.

“They never complained about all the people parked on the road trying to help my neighbors across the street. They didn't make hateful remarks to anybody that got in their way. They just went about their business and let me ask stupid questions, and actually answered them! I can't be grateful enough,” Moore said. ☺
