ecoLINK Fiber Broadband Enters Phase III

High speed internet and telephone service coming to co-op members near Beggs, Bixby, Glenpool, Henryetta, Nuyaka and Okemah

ood news, co-op members! ecoLINK, East Central Electric's fiber broadband subsidiary, announced it is entering Phase III of its five-phase fiber build out.

Phase III includes the fiber huts and feeders of Bald Hill 1, Bald Hill 4,

Beggs 3, Beggs 4, Bixby 3, Bixby 4, Glenpool 1, Glenpool 3, Henryetta West 3, Henryetta West 4, Nuvaka 1, Nuvaka 3, Okemah 2 and Okemah 3. Officials expect feeders and fiber huts to be ready to serve members by March 2022. Fiber huts serve as the main switchboards for the network.

ecoLINK's fiber broadband internet offers upload/download speeds of 100 Mbps or 1 GB Mbps with packages starting at \$55/month. Phone service includes unlimited long distance within 50 states, caller ID, call waiting. call forwarding, and call blocking for \$35/month. Bundle phone and internet and save \$60/year.

Interested in ecoLINK services? Be sure to register (see steps below). Registration ensures that you are notified when your area is open for orders. Registration does not obligate you to receive fiber service, but it can help you beat the rush of anticipated orders. 🖏

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Slow Cooker Hoppin' John

INGREDIENTS

1 lb. dry black-eyed peas 6 cups water 1 large ham hock 12 oz andouille sausage, sliced 1 onion, chopped 2 stalks celery, chopped 4 cloves garlic, minced 2 bay leaves

DIRECTIONS

Place black-eyed peas in a large container and cover with several inches of cool water; let stand 8 hours to overnight. Drain and rinse.

Pour 6 cups water into a pot; add ham hock. Bring to a boil, reduce heat to medium-low, and simmer until meat is tender, about 1 hour. Transfer ham hock to a plate to cool and reserve 4 cups of the cooking liquid.

Layer soaked peas, andouille sausage, onion, celery, and garlic in the bottom of a slow cooker. Remove meat from ham hock and add meat to slow cooker. Sprinkle bay leaves, cumin, salt, and red pepper flakes over the top. Pour reserved cooking water over peas mixture.

Cook on high until peas are tender, at least 4 hours.
