The free ecoLINK+ app gives you easy access to a snapshot view of your home or small business network. Through the app you can view all the connected devices on your network, set up parental controls or a guest network, change your SSID and password, and more. ecoLINK+ puts you in charge!

Key Features

PEOPLE

Connect your Things (devices) with people in your home network. This allows you to set parental controls, content filters, time limits and so much more.

PLACES



THINGS


You can easily find your network details here to connect a new device to your Wi-Fi.

Backwoods Chili Pie

INGREDIENTS

- | | |
|-------------------------|------------------|
| 2 cans favorite chili, | 1/2 C. Crisco |
| or 4 C. homemade | 1/2 C. corn meal |
| 2 C. cooked pinto beans | 4 tsp. water |
| 1 C. flour | 3/4 tsp. salt |

DIRECTIONS

Mix dry ingredients, cut in shortening. Add water to form a soft dough that can be rolled out on a floured surface. Line casserole dish with half the dough. Spoon in chili, cover with rest of dough. Bake at 425 degrees for 20-25 minutes until crust is brown.
