



The books and financial statements of East Central Oklahoma Electric Cooperative, Inc. are audited each year as of December 31. An audit for the year ended December 31, 2023, has been completed by the firm of Briscoe, Burke & Grigsby LLP, Certified Public Accountants, Tulsa, OK. The Comparative Financial Statements shown here are for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2023. East Central Electric's balance sheet reflects 6.23 percent increase in assets. Capital credits and membership fees decreased by \$552,712 which gave our members an equity level of 27.3 percent.




